Summer Reading Guide

To help you choose books that match your English reading level, there's a symbol next to each title:

Green Book – Easier Reads (CEFR A2 Level)

These books use simpler words and shorter sentences. They are perfect for new English learners or anyone who wants a fun and relaxing story.

Blue Book – Intermediate Reads (CEFR B1 Level)

These books are a bit longer and use more varied vocabulary. They are a good challenge for confident readers and help build vocabulary and fluency.

Triple Book – Advanced Reads (CEFR B2 Level)

These books may include more complex ideas, longer chapters, or older-style language. They're great for strong readers who enjoy a deeper or more imaginative story.

Choosing the Right Book

- You don't have to read only from one level; feel free to mix and explore!
- Please note that for almost every book on the list, there is a simplified version (Level A2) in different stores or libraries. Feel free to read the simplified version if it helps you.
- Reading together with a parent or listening to the audiobook while following the text is also a great idea.
- The most important thing is to enjoy reading and find stories that make you curious and happy.
